


We respect him as a courteous gentleman and admire him for his constant readiness to perform his many duties, not only as a brilliant teacher, but as a steadfast friend to each of us.

Your graduation represents the most significant milestone in your career to date. It is the completion of the first stage of your preparation for a full and useful life.


Education begins at birth and extends through life. The need for more and more education is an increasing necessity for one who hopes to compete successfully in a technical age.
