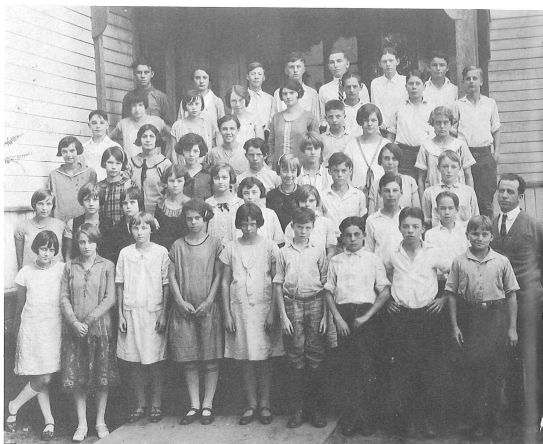


Dade City High School, Dade City, Fla.

Three-quarters of a century has passed since 1887 when a two story frame school was constructed in the block now occupied by the Junior High School.

In 1907, the two story frame building now on the Junior High site near Church Street, was built as an annex to the old school built in 1887. The first graduate of Pasco High was Miss Carrie O'Neal, Class of 1907.



The brick high school (the present Pasco Junior High School) was completed in 1913; Mr. P. W. Corr was the principal, and eight girls made up the first graduating class in 1913. Miss Nina Percival, teacher at P. H. S. from 1915-1953, is pictured above in front of this building. The present Pasco High School was completed in 1949. Mr. Burch Cornelius was the first principal.
