ZHS Reunion Has Deep Roots It's A Family Affair At Annual Gathering

Coming from a one-room schoolhouse in Crystal Springs in the 1930s, Bernice Curtis Rooks went on to be the valedictorian of the Zephyrhills High School Class of 1940.

Rooks, a 94-year-old former Zephyrhills elementary school teacher, was recognized Sunday as the oldest alumnus at the 47th Annual Zephyrhills High School Alumni, Teachers and Friends Reunion.

When Rooks was at the top her class, she and the 16 members of her class walked across the stage at graduation at the former Zephyrhills High School, which is now the home of Stewart Middle School.

"I didn't know what a valedictorian was," Rooks joked. "I came from a small country school and I didn't know all those things. They wanted me to give a speech but I was too bashful. The class president wound up giving the speech."

His nearest neighbor lived twenty miles to the north. There were a number of cattle herders in the state but none had located near him since the area was considered an Indian Rendezvous. His place soon became the headquarters for other cattlemen since there was a large quantity of cattle in that section, and the fine grass range.

Rooks sat with her family at the reunion with several of her students and former fellow educators greeting her with hugs.



"I just love seeing people I haven't seen in a long time," she added. "I just love to hear what their offspring are doing now. I'm really interested in people's family."

The annual reunion is where Rooks gets a chance to flashback to the first-grade classroom where she enjoyed most of her teaching career.

"People come up to me and say hi and then they tell me their name. When they tell me who they are, I see the little first-grader in them," Rooks said. "That is wonderful."

That is what the annual reunion is about. It's about reconnecting with teachers and classmates.

For Zephyrhills Alumni Association Committee President Jerry Pricher, a member of the class of 1969, the event is a homecoming of sorts.

"It's like coming home and that's a good feeling," said Pricher, who has been involved in the Alumni Association Committee for nearly 30 years. "There's a lot of Bulldog pride here."

When Ernie Peeples strapped on his football helmet in 1954 and lined up as a fullback on offense and linebacker on defense, the all-conference standout beamed Bulldog pride. He is still beaming.


"When you play for coach Johnny Clements, you played with pride every play," Peeples said.

"It's important to keep this event going. Some people you may never see again without this. There are people here I haven't seen in years."





Business Meeting Minutes June 6^{TK} , 2017

The June 6 meeting of the Zephyrhills Historical Association was called to order by President Rod Rehrig at 5:30 P.M. He opened with the Invocation and led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Secretary Anna V. Boone read the minutes from the May meeting. Bill Kustes made a motion to accept the minutes as read, seconded by Clereen Brunty and agreed to by all.

Treasurer Clereen Brunty read the Treasurer's Report. Jerry Pricher made a motion to approve the report, seconded by Andy Nagy (after he noted that the \$500 for scholarship recipient, Shelbie Pollack, hadn't been mentioned in the Treasurer's Report and was told the check will be cut for her after she returns from travel.) Everyone accepted the report as read.

Rod Rehrig introduced guest, Beverly Holmes, and she told us about herself. As a Marine and with retirement, she has traveled extensively and remains active with the Marine Corps League serving as chaplain and treasurer. We gladly welcome her as a new member of the Zephyrhills Historical Association.

Old Business: Rod mentioned that our July meeting date falls on the 4th when the library will be closed. Jerry found out that the library is also unavailable on the following Tuesday. After discussion, Clereen made a motion to cancel July's meeting, seconded by Bill and accepted by the group. Jerry said he will still get the newsletter out and we will have our fundraiser at Sergio's on July 25.

Patty Thompson has one more Village Inn pie certificate and will be auctioning it off at the end of the meeting.

Andrew Nagy brought up the idea of hosting a dinner as a fundraiser and said he had approached the American Legion about use of their room but it is not available to the public. Rod said he could ask the VFW, noting that from September on is better for such events as people return from the north. Andrew also suggested having a fundraising picnic. There was much discussion, with Ray Alvarez agreeing to be on a committee with Rod.

Regarding scholarships, Sarah First and Jasmine Sanchez were each given \$1,000. Jerry presented them with framed certificates at the award ceremony.

Other Old Business: Andrew renewed the discussion about honoring Steve Spina as the only surviving charter member of the Association. The particulars have yet to be decided and will be discussed further.

In other old business, Andrew said he didn't think our financial report should be published in the newsletter for the public to read. We were in agreement.

New Business: Clereen Brunty suggested giving Sergio's a plaque of appreciation for their continued support, perhaps an 8X10 with a photo of the Association. Jerry made a motion to approve, seconded by Bill and agreed to by all. Tenci Alexander suggested having a presentation at a birthday or fundraising dinner and maybe having the press involved.

For dinner out, there are no June birthdays so Clereen suggested for the July person to choose, so Bob Porter picked Mike's Smokehouse. We will meet there on June 16 at 4:00 P.M.

Bob made a motion for adjournment, seconded by Tenci and approved by the group. The meeting concluded at 6:05 P.M.
