Zephyrhills Hires Native Son to Replace Outgoing City Manager


When a young Billy Poe was a physical education teacher working at Woodland Elementary School, he would tell his student Jordan Flores to tell her grandfather to give him a job.

The grandfather was Zephyrhills City Manager Steve Spina, who ultimately gave Poe that job with the Zephyrhills Planning Department. That experience launched him into a position to become the City Manager of Dade City.

Last week, Poe was selected for another city job, but this one is to eventually become Spina's replacement as the Zephyrhills City Manager.

Flash back to 15 years ago; Spina did send a job application back with Jordan and the rest is history.

In a Nov. 7 public job interview before the members of Zephyrhills City Council, Poe was selected to be the Assistant City Manager and ultimately replace Spina, who plans to retire in July. Poe's competition for the job was Melanie Kendrick Romagnoli, Program Administrator for the Pasco County Office of Economic Growth.



"There's excitement, nervousness and several emotions going on right now," Poe said, after being offered the position. "There's more pressure because this is my hometown and I know people here. I hope I can live up to their expectations."

Poe was born and raised in Zephyrhills. He is a graduate of Zephyrhills High School, his children go to school in Zephyrhills and his son Josh Fiallo graduated from ZHS.

"To come back to my hometown is really cool," said Poe, who couldn't stop smiling. "I get to influence where I live and what grew me [up] and made me what I am today."

Throughout his tenure in Dade City, Poe has relied on Spina as a mentor who was just a phone call away for guidance. Now Poe will shadow his mentor until Spina retires in the summer.

"I think it will be great working side-by-side with Steve," Poe said. "To be able to sit even closer to Steve and take what I learned in Dade City and take what I learn from him enhances it even more."

The interview process was rapid-fire questioning from city council members and Poe was able to edge out Romagnoli for the job.

"It was interesting. I didn't expect to be standing at a podium," Poe said. "I think I felt a little calmer standing at the podium. The longer I was standing there, the more comfortable I became.

"Poe's contract with Dade City calls for him giving a 90-day notice prior to leaving although that aspect of his contract is negotiable. Under the 90-day stipulation, Poe wouldn't be able to be in his office at the new City Hall until February.

# Honoring Steve Spina







# BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES APRIL 2<sup>ND</sup>, 2019

President Jerry Pricher called the Regular Business Meeting to order, giving the Invocation and leading in the Pledge of Allegiance. The Meeting commenced at 5:30 P.M.

The Secretary's Report was read and amended, as Clereen Brunty pointed out that Joe Radecki was a guest and not a member as listed in the minutes. There was a motion by Rod Rehrig to approve the amended minutes, seconded by Andy Nagy and agreed to by all.

The Treasurer's Report was given by Andy Nagy, approved by Clereen Brunty, seconded by Beverly Holmes and accepted by the group.

Visitors Michael and Sheila Navoy were welcomed to the meeting. They have lived here for a few years, coming originally from New Hampshire where they participated in the historical society.

Guest Dick Woodworth was back and got an application to join. He is a hobbyist who collects presidential campaign posters. He brought in a large jigsaw puzzle depicting presidential campaign candidates throughout the years.

Old Business: Patty Thompson brought in flyers for the April 16 Scholarship Fundraiser at Sergio's. All are encouraged to be there at 4 P.M. to fellowship though the flyers will be honored all day 11 A.M - 9 P.M. Patty also had raffle tickets at \$5 each for an Olive Garden \$50 gift card and she reported that \$250 has been collected so far.

Regarding the Scholarships, Jerry talked to Louie Holt. There have been no applications submitted to the Association so Jerry will talk to the high school principal. Andy asked if the Scholarship Committee members can get copies of the applications. There was discussion about how to award the money, possibly to at least one high school senior and three previous recipients for continuing education.
